## COURT ORDERS THE PUBLICATION IN ITS WEBSITE OF INFORMATION PRESENTED AT THE STAGE OF MONITORING COMPLIANCE WITH JUDGMENT

San Jose, Costa Rica, June 11, 2019.- Today Court Agreement no. 1/19 has been notified- The Agreement specifies some aspects related to the publication of information contained in the case files at the monitoring stage of compliance with the Judgment. The Agreement recognizes the interest shown by academia, non-governmental organizations, and other members of civil society in participating in the execution of the judgments and promotes the involvement of organs, human rights institutions and national courts in compliance with the judgments issued by the Court, being this involvement particularly relevant with regard to those reparations that constitute guarantees of non-repetition.

The Court ordered, among others, the following:

- 1) The Court will publish the information concerning compliance with the guarantees of non-repetition that is presented at the stage of monitoring compliance with the respective judgment.
- 2) The information on compliance with the other measures of reparation in the files on monitoring compliance will not be published, unless the Court or its President decides to the contrary, based on a duly justified request and after hearing the opinion of the parties to the proceedings.
- 3) The Court will publish the amicus curiae briefs.
- 4) The Court will publish information on the implementation of the guarantees of non-repetition received from "other sources" that are not parties to the case, and information provided by experts.

This information will be published in the Court's website, which includes a link to "Cases at the monitoring stage" (<a href="here">here</a> - Only in Spanish), which includes a chronological table of the judgments delivered, organized by State, with direct links to:

- The judgment establishing reparations.
- The orders issued at the stage of monitoring compliance in each case.
- The "Reparations" column that contains links to the "Reparations declared completed" (differentiating those partially completed from those totally completed) and "Reparations pending compliance."
- The briefs submitted during this stage after Agreement no. 1/19 of June 11, 2019 was published, in accordance with the content of said agreement.
