

## PUBLICATION OF THE BOOK JURISPRUDENCE OF THE I/A COURT H.R. AND GOOD PRACTICES REGARDING THE RIGHTS OF INDIGENOUS AND TRIBAL PEOPLES, RIGHT TO A HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT AND HUMAN RIGHTS DEFENDERS



San José, Costa Rica, March 25, 2024.- The Inter-American Court of Human Rights is pleased to announce the publication of the book <u>Jurisprudence of the I/A Court H.R. and Good Practices Regarding the Rights of Indigenous and Tribal Peoples, Right to a Healthy Environment and <u>Human Rights Defenders</u>, which is the result of the organization of the experiences shared during the events named "First Conference on Good Practices Regarding the Rights of Indigenous and Tribal Peoples, Right to a Healthy Environment and Human Rights Defenders" organized by the I/A Court H.R. in El Salvador, Honduras and Guatemala during 2022. The book also includes three articles on the Jurisprudence of the I/A Court H.R. on the rights of indigenous and tribal peoples, the right to a healthy environment and human rights defenders.</u>
