INTER-AMERICAN COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS HELD ITS 177TH REGULAR SESSION

San José, Costa Rica, June 18, 2025. The Inter-American Court of Human Rights held its 177th Regular Session from June 9 to June 13, 2025, virtually. During the session the Court held deliberations and procedures for taking evidence in two contentious cases.

I. Procedures for taking evidence

a. Case of *López De Belva et al. v. Argentina* ¹

In the case of *López De Belva et al. v. Argentina*, the Court held a private oral hearing to obtain evidence during which it received the testimony of the alleged victim, Carlos López De Belva. This procedure was held virtually on June 12, 2025.

b. Case of *Fiallos Navarro v. Nicaragua*

In the case of *Fiallos Navarro v. Nicaragua*, the Court held a private oral hearing to obtain evidence during which it received the testimony of the alleged victim and one witness. This procedure was held virtually on June 13, 2025.

II. Provisional Measures

Expansion of Provisional Measures in the Matter of Juan Sebastián Chamorro et al. v. Nicaragua

The Court approved a Resolution on June 11, 2025, in which it extended the provisional measures adopted in the *Matter of Juan Sebastián Chamorro et al. v. Nicaragua* in favor of three persons: 1) Angélica Patricia Chavarría Altamira, (2) Julio Antonio Quintana Carvajal and (3) José Alejandro Hurtado Díaz. Moreover, at the request of the representative of the beneficiary Jasson Noel Salazar Rugama, it ordered the rectification of the Resolution of March 27, 2025, to include the beneficiary's full name. III. Advisory Opinion

Deliberation concluded on the Advisory Opinion on "The content and scope of the right to care and its interrelation with other rights" submitted by the Republic of Argentina (AO-31/2023). The Court will notify the decision in a timely manner.

IV. Pending cases, monitoring compliance with judgments and administrative matters

The Court continued hearing several pending matters, monitoring compliance with judgments and the implementation of provisional measures. It also addressed several administrative matters.
