

PUBLICATION OF THE JURISPRUDENCE JOURNAL OF THE INTER-AMERICAN COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS NO. 41: JURISPRUDENCE REGARDING COSTA RICA



San José, Costa Rica, August 29, 2024. The Inter-American Court of Human Rights (I/A Court HR) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Worship of Costa Rica are pleased to announce the publication of [*Jurisprudencia Journal No. 41: Jurisprudence regarding Costa Rica*](#), in the context of the 45th anniversary of the installation of the seat of the Court in that country.

The new publication was presented in the Salón Dorado of Casa Amarilla (seat of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs). The Minister of Foreign Affairs, Arnoldo André Tinoco, indicated that: "The journal presented today, apart from exemplifying the impact of the I/A Court HR in the terms described thus far, evidences the absolute respect, good faith and authentic commitment of the Republic of Costa Rica to the jurisdiction and authority of the Court, while also aiming to organize the most relevant elements of form and substance covered in the national cases, incorporating aspects of competence and admissibility, both in contentious and advisory proceedings."

The President of the I/A Court HR stated that: "This collaboration is a testimony of the mutual respect between the Court and the State of Costa Rica. Through dialogue and cooperation, we have worked to ensure that human rights are respected and protected in Costa Rica, and to promote standards that strengthen democratic values and human dignity in the region."

This is the 11th Jurisprudence Journal of the I/A Court HR dedicated to organizing the jurisprudence of the Court regarding a specific State. It was prepared jointly by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Worship and the Inter-American Court of Human Rights. This Journal represents the joint efforts and fruitful dialogue between the Inter-American Court of Human Rights and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Costa Rica, focused on the protection and guarantee of human rights.

It is especially relevant to note that all judgments compiled in this journal have been fully complied with by the State of Costa Rica, which reflects its history and exemplary commitment to the Court and to promoting human rights.

We hope that this Jurisprudence Journal will help to disseminate the judgments of the Inter-American Court regarding Costa Rica among its authorities, judges, members of the prosecutor's and public defender's offices, academia and civil society organizations, as well as among individuals interested in the decisions of the Court in the country and the whole region.

The series Jurisprudence Journals of the Inter-American Court of Human Rights aims to disseminate the main lines of jurisprudence of the Court in several relevant topics of regional interest.
