LAUNCH OF THE VIRTUAL CLASSROOM OF THE I/A COURT HR'S TRAINING CENTER AND THE FIRST SELF-TAUGHT COURSES IN PORTUGUESE

San José, Costa Rica, September 6, 2024. – As part of the celebration of the 45th anniversary since its installation, the Inter-American Court of Human Rights is pleased to announce the launch of the Training Center's Virtual Classroom in Portuguese, as well as the first self-taught courses in that language. With this new step, the scope of the Court's education program is broadened to reach the Portuguese-speaking audience, mainly in Brazil, for both the specialized and general public.

The purpose of these courses is to disseminate the work of the I/A Court HR and its case law; they are free of charge and universally accessible through a computer or mobile phone with Internet access. Each course is composed of ten video lessons taught by experts from the Inter-American Human Rights System, with supplemental readings and other educational resources.
